# **Administration Committee Report**

Happy Holidays from the Administration Committee.

The Administration Committee, with Board approval, develops policies and plans for operating the ElderStudy organization, monitors finances and projects future needs, proposes an annual budget, recommends annual fees, and periodically reviews ElderStudy governing documents for recommendation of potential changes.

Most of the Committee activities since the report in the October Newsletter have revolved around the continued review and proposed revisions to the Procedures Manual by the Manual Subcommittee. As part of the status report presented to the Board of Directors at their September 5th meeting, a draft of the proposed changes was provided to each Director and Committee Chairperson for review and comment; there were no changes proposed to the ElderStudy Constitution or to the Memorandum Of Understanding with the University. On September 26th, a joint working meeting was conducted to receive comments and to allow for discussion of any issues/concerns. Based on these discussions, the Committee recommended changes/revisions, including a title change from **Procedures Manual** to **Policy & Procedures Document** will be presented to the Board of Directors at their December 5th Meeting for approval. Pending Board approval, the revised ByLaws will be presented to the General Membership for approval at the General Membership Meeting on March 20th; copies of the revised ByLaws will be distributed to the membership in late February for review, comment, and approval.

The regular Quarterly Meeting of the Administration Committee was held on November 27th with a Tentative Agenda which included the First Quarter Preliminary Treasurer's Reports, discussion of the Manual review status, a discussion regarding the Bachelor of Liberal Studies Scholarship for 2013-2014, and likely discussion of the 2011-2012 Audit Report. The First Quarter Financial Reports will be posted on the bulletin board in Chandler 102 following approval by the Board of Directors on December 5. Subsequent Administration Committee Meetings are scheduled for February 27th (1-3 PM, Woodard Room 2) and May 29th (1-3 PM, Woodard Room 2). Participation by the ElderStudy membership is encouraged.
