Administration Committee Report

The Administration Committee, with Board of Directors guidance, develops policies and plans for operating the ElderStudy organization, monitors finances and projects future needs, proposed an annual budget with recommended annual fees, and periodically reviews ElderStudy governing documents relative to potential need for revision or change. The Committee meets quarterly about 7-9 days in advance of the Board of Directors Meetings.

The most recent Committee Meeting was held on November 26 in the Center for Lifelong Learning Room. At this meeting, the Treasurer presented Preliminary Financial Reports for the First Quarter for Committee discussion. An important item of New Business discussion was the development of a recommendation regarding the 2014-2015 Bachelor of Liberal Studies Scholarship; as the year-to-date income from membership fees exceeds the budget projection, it is likely that the Committee will recommend a \$1000 Scholarship to the Board of Directors at the December 4th Quarterly Board Meeting.

The next Administration Committee Meetings are scheduled for February 25, 2014 and May 27, 2014 at 1 PM in the Center of Lifelong Learning at the UMW Stafford Campus [Room SC210 South]. At the February Meeting, the main New Business topic will be the planning of the Budget Call for 2014-2014. At the May Meeting, recommendations will be developed regarding (i)Membership fees for 2014-2015, (ii) regarding a budget for 2014-2015, and(iii) regarding the availability & use of any excess funds.
