These original families have preserved their heritage, and created a foundation with a visitor center that enables descendants to trace their lineage. Barbara Barrett

Barbara moved to Stafford County from Northern Virginia in 1993 and joined ElderStudy a few years later. She recently became a member of the Administrative Committee. Her professional career spanned 30 years in the social science research field, planning and managing survey research and program evaluation projects. Barbara has a B.A. from the University of Connecticut and an M.A. from the University of Hawaii. She has been president of three homeowners' associations and presently serves on the boards of the Central Rappahannock Heritage Center, the Fredericksburg Festival of the Performing Arts, and the Woman's Club of Fredericksburg. Her interests include travel, history, the arts, reading, and her family.



Phil Hall

Phil grew up in New Jersey, and graduated from the College of Wooster in Wooster, Ohio. He got his Ph.D in Chemistry from the University of Chicago in 1967 and served on the faculty at Virginia Tech for a total of 17 years, first as professor of chemistry and later as Assistant Provost. In 1985 he came to Mary Washington College as Vice President for Academic Affairs and Dean of the Faculty. Phil joined ElderStudy soon after his retirement in 2004 and has "enjoyed it enormously ever since." Phil is a member of the Curriculum Committee and is one of the "regulars" at Book Group. He was elected a member of the ES Board of Directors in 2006, served as vice president in 2007-8 and president in 2008-9. Although not currently an elected member of the Board he accepted an invitation by the Board and is currently serving as president for the 2011-2012 academic year.

Chuck Watkins

Chuck is originally from Roanoke, but attended high school in Hawaii. He received his M.S. in microbiology at Virginia Tech before entering the Air Force where he served 28 years as a pilot, clinical laboratory manager, hospital commander, as as Chief of the Biomedical Sciences Corps. After retirement, from active duty, he was a contract consultant in quality improvement at Headquarters Marine Corps, and then a federal civil servant in communications research at the TRICARE Management Activity in Falls Church before retiring again in 2010. He and his wife Dede reside in the Retreat Subdivision in Fredericksburg but spend part of the winter in Viera, Florida. Chuck and Dede are active in Newcomer's Club, the Fredericksburg Wine Society where Chuck serves as co-treasurer, and in church activities where Chuck serves as Sunday School Superintendent and as a deacon. Chuck takes a 5-mile walk nearly every day and spends most of the rest of the day as a self-directed stock options trader. This is his second year in ElderStudy; he currently serves as our Webmaster and is a member of the book Group.

Bill Wemmerus

Bill joined ElderStudy ten years ago, shortly after moving to Virginia from New York State where he worked in education for more than thirty years.
