# **Administration Committee Report**

The Administration Committee met on May 29, 2012 for its regular Quarterly Meeting. The Committee received the Treasurer's Preliminary Third Quarter Financial Reports for the period September 1, 2011 to May 29, 2012; the reports were approved for presentation to the Board of Directors on May 31<sup>st</sup>. <u>Under Old Business</u>, the Policy and Procedures Sub-Committee reported on progress and plans for the complete review of the current Procedures Manual; a presentation to the Board of Directors at its September 5<sup>th</sup> meeting is now planned. <u>Under New Business</u>, the Committee developed recommendations regarding (a) a Proposed 2012-2013 ElderStudy Operating Budget, (b) a proposed distribution of excess funds as Grants to University departments supporting the 2011-2012 Program, and (c) an individual to serve as Administration Committee 2012-2013 Chairperson. These recommendations were presented to the Board of Directors on May 31<sup>st</sup> and received Board approval.

The Administration Committee Quarterly Meetings for 2012-2013 have been scheduled as follows: August 29 (Wednesday) from 10-12, November 27 (Tuesday) from 1-3, February 27 (Wednesday) from 1-3, and May 29 (Wednesday) from 1-3. All Quarterly meetings will be held in Woodard Hall Room 2. Additional meetings will be scheduled as needed to complete Committee assignments.

#### **COMING TO THE THEATRE THIS FALL**

September 20<sup>th</sup> thru September 30<sup>th</sup> - Talking With... is an American play by Jane Martin, published by Samuel French Incorporated. The play is composed of eleven ten-minute monologues, each featuring a different woman who talks about her life. The play deals with the personal ordeals of each of the female characters. Many of them are very touching; a few are even intensely emotional. However, there is also the very comical. Even the funny ones, however, have an underlying depth to them that gives a sensitive insight into each of the characters involved. The ladies cover a wide spectrum of life and age from the fading rodeo star in "Rodeo" to the young aspiring actress in "Audition", there is much tenderness and diversity in the subject matter involved in the play.

November 1st thru 18th - Into the Woods is a musical with music and lyrics by Stephen Sondheim and book by James Lapine. The musical intertwines the plots of several Brothers Grimm fairy tales and follows them further to explore the consequences of the characters' wishes and quests. The main characters are taken from the stories of Little Red Riding Hood, Jack and the Beanstalk, Rapunzel, and Cinderella, tied together by a more original story involving a baker and his wife and their quest to begin a family, most likely taken from the original story of Rapunzel by the Brothers Grimm. It also includes references to several other well-known tales.
