TREASURER'S REPORT

The two financial reports named and summarized below are posted on the website.

Operations Report #12 Closeout of the 2019-2020 Fiscal Year has gone smoothly. Notable highlights include the following:

- 1. We took in \$21,115.00 in membership fees, \$1,675 more than provided for in the Approved Budget.
- 2. We expended \$2,499.11 less than the Approved Budget, largely owing to restrictions to our activities caused by the Covid 19 shutdown that started in March 2020.
- 3. The Board of Directors was able to fund grants totaling \$1,900.

Balance Sheet Report #4 ElderStudy assets at the end of FY 2019-2020, including our three CDs, total \$56,836.55. Our total liabilities are \$22,688.86, including a balance of \$2,563.21 in the classroom contingency reserve. Our net of assets to liabilities is \$34,147.69.

<u>2020-2021 Current Fiscal Year</u> Fiscal Year 2019-2020 proved to be a challenging one because of Covid 19, and FY 2020-2021 promises to be equally challenging. As your new Treasurer, who was in training until the first of this month, I was able to witness firsthand how the Board of Directors and the many volunteers who assist them rose to those challenges this spring and summer.

Their collective response has been nothing short of marvelous. By rapidly converting to online sessions accessible via Zoom, ElderStudy was able to offer several classes over the summer and continues to develop what promises to be a full slate of online sessions for this fall and spring, if necessary. I am loathe to provide names because it seems to me that everyone has been working hard to ensure that ElderStudy can continue to provide valuable educational experiences to our members, whatever the circumstances. However, I will single out one person for my personal thanks – retiring Treasurer Bryn Pavek. She has gone out of her way to help me understand not only how to perform the many tasks associated with being Treasurer, but also ElderStudy as an organization and the many people who work to keep it going. I will do my best to emulate her excellent example.

Many thanks to Carol Walker who has volunteered to retype the entire P&P. During the course of the 2020 updates, we discovered a number of internal Word Processing problems with our current text – embedded hidden commands that affected margins, headers & footers, paragraph spacing, etc. Carol is retyping the entire P&P so that we have a fresh, de-bugged template next spring when we begin the 2021 update.

Luscious Salad

This makes many servings, so it is popular at family and large gatherings. Spread in layers, bottom up:

One head of chopped lettuce
One head of chopped cauliflower
Two cups of mayonnaise
One medium onion, diced
Cook one pound of bacon and
crumble this layer
²/₃ cup of Parmesan cheese
¹/₂ cup of sugar

Refrigerate for 24 hours and toss just before serving. Enjoy!

Banana Cake

½ cup butter

1½ cups sugar

2 eggs slightly beaten

1 cup mashed banana (two very large or three small)

1 teaspoon vanilla

2 cups flour

½ teaspoon baking soda

1/4 teaspoon salt

½ cup milk

Cream the butter, gradually add the sugar.

Add eggs and beat thoroughly.

Add banana pulp and vanilla.

Sift the dry ingredients together and add to the "sugar mix," alternately with the milk.

Bake at 350°F for 30 minutes.

The cake is dense and moist, so you can use your own cream cheese "thin" drizzle icing or get ready-made cream cheese icing.
